Constructing your Curriculum

Training for practitioners working in PVIs and schools



Currently, there is considerable focus on the intent, implementation and impact of the early years' curriculum. Inspectors will evaluate the impact that the quality of education has on children, particularly the most disadvantaged and those with SEND.

In this course we will be considering the following to help you plan your early years curriculum effectively to suit your children and your setting:

- what your children already know.
- how learning builds sequentially by building knowledge, skills and learning behaviours from what the children already know and can do towards identified end points or outcomes
- the role of adults in moving children's learning on
- the accessibility and suitability of resources
- how children's interests are utilised and valued
- the statutory requirements in each of the seven areas of learning outlined in the Educational Programmes statements in the EYFS statutory framework.

Often, this leads to role-play as children grow which helps to develop other skills such as empathy, problem-solving, and morality. The EYFS framework states that writing involves transcription (spelling and handwriting) and composition (articulating ideas and structuring them in speech, before writing). This course aims to support practitioners with their practice to support children to become confident early writers.
